


It all starts and ends with Jesus Christ. Jesus runs through our core, our love for Jesus is our motivation and our heart.

"I started when I was 4 because I wanted to be cool like my dad. He pulled me in his bike chariot when he did the Ride for Refuge for the two years before that, so I learned how to ride a bike just so I could ride with him in the Ride for Refuge!

As I got older, I had a better understanding of why we were doing it and how it helped people. I would go with my mom to bring groceries to people who were working hard, but still didn't have enough money for food. And I got see her help people celebrate when they were debt free. I could see how people went from really hard situations to something better and I loved that I could be part of that.

Plus, every year we raise more money and it's cool to see how people will give when I ask them to help!"



say money is their top source of stress, the first increase since 2020




1 in 4 Canadians

The rising cost of groceries continues to be the top factor (69%) impacting Canadians financial stress

For some Canadians, the added worry over their finances is having an isolating social impact. Of those Canadians identifying as part of the financially stressed group, 55 per cent say they feel more isolated due to rising costs of living and that is impacting those close to them.
