But once I joined the Board I saw why and how it works. Because this organization really cares about helping people - and they actually can.

What is most exciting is that CAP is still relatively young in Canada but are carving out a space where no other organizations have the resources or community support at the same level. This is exciting. There is so much potential. We are not at full max capacity yet and there is room to grow.

2021 was an impactful year. Although Canada is just beginning a recovery phase in many ways, CAP is putting down strong roots in the communities we operate in and continued to make an impact in our clients lives, and just like Canada we see hope in the future.

Debt is so real. I personally experienced debt in my family when I was younger, and the shame people feel is real, even though most debt is by no circumstance of their own. I have friends and family currently in debt and when I tell them about CAP it didn't even cross their minds that there is a service out there that is willing to help them, step by step, to get out of their debt. All while providing a supporting community around them. And there are more of them out there in Canada, yearning for help.

Building an organization and getting reach to those in need can take time, but I have full confidence that CAP is on the right path. And I feel blessed to be a part of their story."

Your donations at work




The majority of operating expenses are allocated to staff wages and benefits which we ensure are fair and competitive within the non-profit sector.

Ruby's story

When my husband passed away my income was cut right in half, because all we had was our pensions. And I thought, there is just no way, there is no way I can manage this. My husband took care of all the finances, and when he passed away I was petrified, I had visions of being out on the street, the bills were piling up and I had no idea how to pay. There were also some debts I was unaware of.

I went into panic mode.

I was talking to my friend at church and she told me about the CAP money and I decided to take it. And it was the best thing I have ever done.

I was actually amazed how generous people were, and how kind and willing they were to help me out and straighten out my debt. Number one was to get over my fear of managing money and second was to focus on getting out of debt.

By sticking to the budgeting plan, within in a year and a half I was free from debt, and my mortgage was covered.

I would suggest anyone taking the CAP money course, no matter your age. It's a life changer, it's a life saver.

Message from our CEO

As we stepped into 2021 the Board and I knew this would be a year where we needed to regroup, refocus and embrace the exciting challenge laid out in Isaiah 43:18-19, "Forget the former things; do not dwell on the past. See, I am doing a new thing! Now it springs up; do you not perceive it? I am making a way in the wilderness and streams in the wasteland."

2020 saw significant shifts, for churches, for communities, for those in need — and we were there to ensure that our service was ready to support hundreds and thousands of Canadians overwhelmed by debt - to support those who have and will call our toll free number, book an appointment with a local Debt Centre and have the opportunity to have their lives radically transformed.

In 2021, we saw a 50% increase in the number of clients reaching out to us for help - despite many referral groups not being open or having face to face sessions - those facing difficulties are searching for help and support.

I am delighted to share that we opened two new Debt Centres - an amazing achievement, and a huge testimony to the desire of the local church to serve it's community and respond to crisis with love, compassion and practical help. That's two new communities of Canadians that we are able to serve through our free credit counselling, in partnership with incredible faith filled churches.

As many services were closed or had reduced hours – the challenges facing our most vulnerable clients increased exponentially. The housing crisis, food insecurity, additional costs of being at home for extended periods, a lack of community from closed libraries, service supports etc. all meant, that for those we serve, the impact on mental, physical and emotional health has been massive.

With all these difficulties it would be understandable for the Debt Centre Managers and churches to have stepped away, but instead, they stepped forward - organizing food for clients, walking dogs for those who had injured themselves, helping clients move homes, caring for the vulnerable in beautiful and creative ways - with a personal favourite of mine being the online Christmas cooking courses hosted by one church - even if my request for cookies didn't materialize!

My highlight of the year, was seeing church after church beautifully demonstrating the love of Jesus in their communities. Truly it is amazing to see the church in action.

Your generosity and your willingness to serve have made all of this possible - thank you for you trusting us.

As we move forward into 2022 it is with a certainty that, as we continue to develop our voice and our services, the need is only growing - and we are ready and willing to respond, "Here am I! Send me!"
